In honor of the 150th anniversary of the Pony Express, this year's Harvest Festival revolves around a "Ride With the Best" theme.

The festival is Thursday through Saturday, Sept. 16-18 in Gothenburg.

Festivities begin Thursday at 5:30 p.m. with a pooch parade/dog show in Ehmen Park. A Farmer's Market is from 4:30 to 6 p.m. on 10th Street west of Lake Avenue.

On Friday, a kids' parade begins at 6 p.m. Children will gather in Ehmen Park for judging at 5:30 p.m. The parade begins at the intersection of 16th Street and Avenue F.

Hilltop Estates and Care Center is celebrating 15 years with a free hot dog feed in Ehmen Park from 5:30-7:30 p.m.

A pitch tournament is scheduled to begin at the Randazzle Cafe at 7 p.m.

Saturday's activities begin with a pancake breakfast at the Gothenburg Airport from 7-10 a.m. A fly-in is from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Throughout the day, vintage aircraft will be displayed as well as hot air balloons and power chutes.

The 8th annual dog & jog is set for 8 a.m. at the airport. Registration begins at 7:30 a.m. and proceeds go to the United Way.

Line-up for the festival parade, beginning at 20th Street and proceeding down Lake Avenue, begins at 9:30 a.m. The parade begins at 10:30 a.m. on Lake Avenue from 20th to Ninth Street.

Many activities are set in Ehmen Park after the parade including food booths, arts, crafts, kids’ games, a dunking booth and jumping toys.

Lunch is available there or at the United Methodist Church from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m.

The Gothenburg Historical Museum, at 15th Street and Avenue F, will have collections on display from 11:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

A show and shine car show will be on 15th Street between Lake Avenue and Avenue F from 11:30 a.m.-3 p.m.
