Congestion during blizzard on curved portion.

Truckers and other motorists take heed.

No parking signs could soon be installed along the curved portion of Platte River Drive to avoid traffic bottlenecks during bad weather.

Terry Jessen, owner and developer of Comfort Suites Hotel and Terry's Business Park, asked for no-parking signs along the curve because of the number of semi-trailer trucks parked there during a January blizzard that caused several weather-related accidents.

The hotel is west of the curved portion of the street.

Interstate 80 closed for a time that Sunday which city administrator Bruce Clymer said brought trucks into town, many of which parked along the curve of Platte River Drive.

"People couldn't get through because trucks were in the way," Clymer said.

Although such parking problems rarely happen, R.J. Parmeter, who works for Jessen, said business is disrupted and emergency vehicles are hindered when it does.

If the proposal passes, signs will be erected on the south side of the street.
