Without it, the Senior Center likely couldn't afford to transport residents to and from center activities and meals, as well as to medical appointments and shopping.

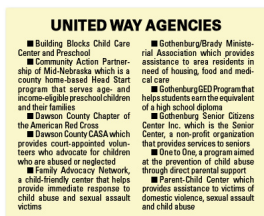

Last year's United Way allocation to Building Blocks Child Care Center and Preschool in Gothenburg was used to purchase a new computer. This year's funding will likely be used for playground improvements.

The Gothenburg/Brady Ministerial Association helps families in need through assistance paying for utilities, rent, food and medical care. Each United Way dollar makes a difference for another disadvantaged resident.



"It's all about people helping people," Blase said.

The Gothenburg United Way will kick off its annual fund-raising campaign with a freewill donation dinner at the Senior Center from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Sunday.

The 2009-10 goal is \$24,000, up slightly from last year's goal of \$23,800.

"The goal is up only a little bit," Blase said, "but because of the economy, it's still going to be difficult to reach it."

Residents unable to attend the kickoff dinner are still encouraged to donate using a brochure mailed to each home.

Following the individual mail portion of the campaign, United Way will have a business drive.
