This year's annual Dawson County Fair will begin the week before school rather than in July as it's occurred the past several years.

The fair, with the theme "Last Blast of Summer" offers everything from pig wrestling and stock dog competition to music, a demolition derby and 4-H events.

Located at the Lexington fairgrounds, the fair officially kicks off this Saturday and continues through Saturday, Aug. 11.

The Moore's Greater Shows carnival opens Friday night and will be open every evening through Saturday, Aug. 11.

Family night is Wednesday evening.

Throughout the fair, vendors will be lined up in the commercial building who will sell merchandise and offer information on county agencies.

A long-time restaurant at the fair—the 4-H Cafe—will be open Saturday, Aug. 4, from 8 a.m.-6 p.m.; Sunday, Aug. 5, from 8 a.m.-3 p.m.; Tuesday, Aug. 7, 8 am.-7:30 p.m.; Wed., Aug. 8, from 10 a.m.-7:30 p.m.; Thursday, Aug. 9, from 10 a.m.-9 p.m.; and Friday, Aug. 10, and Saturday, Aug. 11, from 8 a.m.-7:30 p.m.
