Weber, who lived in Gothenburg from 1997 to 2003, is thrilled to be back after taking over a position that opened up after Stacy Anderson joined Monsanto.

“When I first started with TierOne in North Platte, I would drive past this one and know that I wanted to work here someday,” Weber said. “When it happened, that was cool.”

A former cosmetologist, she started working at TierOne Bank branches in North Platte as a teller in 2008.
