

Lake Helen is site for annual Dawson County Relay For Life

Bicycles and candles will light up the night at the 19th Annual American Cancer Society Relay For Life of Dawson County on Friday, July 12, at Lake Helen in Gothenburg.

Cancer survivor “Willie” Martin Stoddard of Cozad and a dedicated group of bikers will ride a lap or two with flashing lights coiled on their bike frames.

“The bicycle ride with the lighted luminaria candles promises to be an impressive part of this year’s Relay For Life,” said Pam Ackerman, event chairperson, of Lexington. “I’m always amazed at the creativity and imagination that adds that extra special flair to our event.”

The Light Up The Night Bike Ride will be after the luminaria ceremony which starts at 9:30 p.m. Stoddard, 30, also will be the luminaria ceremony speaker.

At age 17 and a senior in high school, he was diagnosed with acute lymphoblastic leukemia. He had chemotherapy treatments for three and a half years which led to having both hips and his right knee replaced.

“I went through treatments at Children’s Hospital in Omaha. At 6-foot-3, I felt like a giant there,” Stoddard said. He added there isn’t a better way to say it other than “cancer sucks.”

“Cancer is a terrible and devastating disease. It changes everything in your life,” he said. “Organizations like Relay For Life helped out my family and I when I was going through my treatments. Three trips to Omaha and back can be very costly. But the ability to be in my own home, in my own bed was absolutely amazing.

“That is why I try to be as active as I can in the Relay.”

This is his third year as a team member with The Church Ladies. Last year when it was dark at Relay, Stoddard started thinking about how amazing it would be to have bikers with flashing lights riding around for a while. "I talked it over with friends and asked to get it in this year since it is at the park," he said. "I'm expecting roughly 10 riders there, maybe less, maybe more."

The luminaria ceremony and bike ride are just a couple of many events and activities as everyone works to "Round Up A Cure," Ackerman said. "Everyone is invited to attend the Relay. This is a community event to raise awareness about cancer and the American Cancer Society as well as provide a fun atmosphere for family."

Survivors and caregivers kickoff the overnight event with the Lap of Hope at 6 p.m. All cancer survivors and caregivers are encouraged to arrive early to register at the survivor booth between 4:30-5:30 p.m.

The Silent Auction from 6 to 9 p.m. will be under the south restroom shelter area at Lake Helen. Some of the items on the auction will be a Husker wagon, Jack Hoffman rookie trading cards, homemade quilts, cowboy art and auto detail. Many more items are expected.

Team walking starts around 6:30 p.m. Fifteen teams will have at least one team member on the walking path at all times throughout the night. Many teams will be selling "round up" style food and drinks. A root beer saloon, trail mix, beef jerky, walking tacos, pulled pork sandwiches, campfire ham and beans, cotton candy and snow cones are on the menu.

Activities, games and fundraisers start around 7 p.m. with highlights on the Miss Relay Contest, Locks of Love, karaoke, jail and bail, tattoos, pony rides and a bouncy house. The American Cancer Society Mission Booth features a Ranch Rodeo competition and informational brochures. ACS Advocacy will fill the I Am Hope banner with notes to legislators asking for support to fight cancer.

Miss Relay will be crowned at 8:45 p.m. and will participate in a line dance. A \$100 Walmart Gift Card will be given away around 9 p.m. Tickets are available from any team captain or at the Relay for \$1 each or six for \$5.
