

GHS senior headed to Girls Nation in D.C.

However, one Gothenburg senior will experience her last high school summer differently.

July 20 through July 27, Carlin Daharsh will travel to Washington, D.C., for American Legion Auxiliary Girls Nation.

About 400 girls competed for the two positions at Girls State in Lincoln, June 1-7. She was elected secretary of state by her peers.

Before the election, Daharsh campaigned the eight floors of Abel Hall on the campus of University of Nebraska-Lincoln.

“Each of the floors represented a town, and the next four represented counties,” Daharsh said. “All together, the dorm we stayed in represented a state.”

To be eligible for Girls Nation, she ran for senate. Daharsh was on stage with 50 other girls and received enough votes to qualify in the top eight, she said.
