That's a big reason to donate to the fund that gives money to 11 different agencies in the community and Dawson County, according to United Fund president Angie Nichols.

Nichols noted that four of the groups who receive funds are in the county and "help people in our community."

This year, United Fund board members hope to raise \$21,700 to support the agencies which is a 5.8% increase over last year's amount of \$20,500.

The Gothenburg Ministerial Association re-joined the list of 11 agencies who asked for and will receive money in 2013-14.

Nichols said Larry Viter is the chair of the association of local ministers who help people with travel emergencies or who have trouble paying rent, utility bills or buying food or who have other needs.

United Fund's annual campaign will begin this week when donor brochures are mailed to each Gothenburg household.

A freewill donation meal on Sunday, Oct. 13, at the Gothenburg Senior Center serves as the official campaign kickoff.

Baldwin Filters, Nichols said, is the front-runner in contributions.

UNITED FUND AGENCIES

■ **American Lutheran Church food pantry**—A service that provides non-perishable food to local families in need.
■ **Building Blocks Child Care Center and Preschool**—A day care and preschool that offers a safe learning environment to children 8 weeks to 5 years old.
■ **Community Action Partnership of Mid-Nebraska**—A home-based Head Start program that serves age- and income-eligible preschool children and their families.
■ **Dawson/DeSper County CASA**—A volunteer-driven organization of court-appointed volunteers who advocate for children who have been abused or neglected.
■ **Dawson/DeSper County American Red Cross**—A chapter of the national organization which offers services to help prevent, prepare for and respond to emergencies.
■ **Family Advocacy Network**—A child-friendly center that helps provide immediate response to child abuse and sexual assault victims.
■ **Gothenburg Ministerial Association**—A local group of ministers who provide assistance to area residents in need of utilities, rent, food, clothing, medi-

cal care, child-care supplies, temporary housing and emergency travel.
■ **Gothenburg CED Program**—An educational service that helps students successfully complete requirements to earn the equivalent of a high school diploma.
■ **Gothenburg Senior Citizens Center Inc.**—This non-profit organization provides meals and other services to seniors, helping them maintain their independence.
■ **Gothenburg TeamMates**—A school-based mentoring program that pairs adult volunteers with students.
■ **Parent-Child Center**—A comprehensive assistance program for victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and child abuse.
