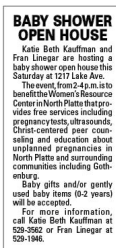

Linegar joined her and the two have donations of food, flowers and baby items from businesses, organizations, churches and the community for the shower.

Kauffman said it's difficult to be pregnant and a new mother even with a supportive husband.



“I can’t imagine going through that without any family support,” she said.

While involved supporting a pregnancy center in Denver, CO, with Brandon, Kauffman said they heard of young mothers carrying new babies home from the hospital in towels because they didn’t have blankets.

“This is a real opportunity for us to come alongside and love on them,” she said.

She and Linegar are hosting the shower to help young women and the WRC as the center assists them through a difficult time.

“They share the message of Jesus’ love with women in their time of need,” Kauffman said.

WRC director Amy Woods said the center staff is thrilled that Kauffman and Linegar have chosen to support and promote the center’s work.
