France swept the varsity field in both entertainment and humorous speaking while Picci won extemporaneous and persuasive speaking in the novice division at the second of two Central Nebraska Forensic League meets in Grand Island.

Novices are first-year speech competitors.

Also placing first in varsity events were Abbie Mazour in serious prose and Carlin Daharsh in persuasive speaking.

Speech coach Dan Jensen said he was pleased with the efforts of the team.

"Our kids are scoring very well in a very tough field of competition," Jensen said, noting that CNFL meets have grown large with 36 schools competing Saturday. "It's easy to be overwhelmed by the numbers."

He pointed out that the Swedes are at a challenging point of the season.

"As it wears on, it's becoming more clear which events are working out and which ones need some extra work," Jensen said.

Perhaps the greatest challenges is keeping material fresh that has been performed in competition dozens of times, he said.
