Speech coach Dan Jensen said both the varsity and novice teams continue to show improvement each week.

“The kids realize they have to keep that up if we are going to continue on this track,” Jensen said. “The results were favorable at the Gothenburg meet but we must keep those results in perspective,”

Comparatively speaking, he said Gothenburg was a small meet compared to this weekend when the Swedes compete at the North Platte Blue & Gold—a two-day contest with debate on Friday and speech on Saturday.

“This will be a good test against some incredibly challenging teams,” Jensen said.
