

City councilman files for re-election to seat

As the deadline for incumbents seeking re-election nears, one more local office holder has announced his intention to keep his seat.

East-ward city councilman Tim Strauser filed for the office.

It will be Strauser's first time running for election since he was appointed to fill former councilman Roger Dudley's term.

Because federal, state and county offices will be closed Presidents' Day on Monday, Feb. 15, the deadline has been extended to Tuesday, Feb. 16.

Challengers have until March 1 to file.
