With outstanding athletes like Emily Max and Ali Abramson returning to the track this spring, Gothenburg girls coach Steve Reeves knows the Swedes will have a competitive team.

Both senior girls return as state qualifiers in three events each and join a group of 10 other letter winners to lead the Swedes this season.

“Ali and Emily gave great effort every meet last year,” Reeves said.

Abramson ran both distance races in Omaha as well as the 4x400 relay.

Max finished third in Class B in the 300-meter hurdles and was a member of both the 4x100 and 4x400 relay teams.

“We expect good things out of them again and hopefully Tabitha (Paul) and Joslyn (Oliver) are healthy and can help us out too,” Reeves said.

“The key for the girls team is going to be getting younger kids to step up and fill varsity roles,” Reeves said.

That expectation isn’t too far fetched. Reeves said there is plenty of talent on the team, just not much experience.

Of the 33 girls out for track, only four are seniors. Twelve come from the freshman class.

“We’ve got good kids in several events,” Reeves said of the team’s strength, “but depth will be an issue.”

Hopefully, he said, that will improve as the season goes on.

The Swede girls defeated Broken Bow in the Southwest Conference meet last spring.

Reeves said while the Indians lost several of their top athletes, they will likely be among the best of the conference again.

Minden’s girls have seen plenty of success in athletics this year. Reeves said the Whippets will also prove to be tough in the conference.
