But the juniors and seniors were not alone. Reeves commended the younger boys who contributed to the team score as well.



"Tannor (Mroczek), Mark (Hilderbrand) and Andrew (Collins) did what they've done all year and continue to compete at a high level," Reeves said of each boy's winning performances. "But we saw some very good things from a couple of young kids as well."

Mroczek won both the sprint races and Hilderbrand won both hurdle events while Collins finished first and second in the 800 and 1600, respectively.

Reeves said sophomore Brandon Wlasiuk's win in the high jump at 6-feet even and Brett Dockweiler's silver in the 3200-meter run were both notable.

"They continue to improve each week," the coach said. "That's a big thing."

In all, Gothenburg boys earned 20 places, including first in the mile medley relay, an event specific to the Zorn meet.



Logan Sheets and Landen Haake each ran legs of 200 meters while Eric Stevens ran 400 meters and Bryce Eggleston completed 800, all in a medley time of 3:51.8.

Some Swedes will compete in the Brady-Gothenburg Invite here on Thursday while the majority of the varsity squad will travel to Lexington on Friday for the Don Bader Invite.
