

Swedes fall to Valentine, Ogallala.

COZAD—Emotions were high in the Cozad High School gym last week.

Not only was Oct. 26 the first time the cross-county rivals met in head-to-head action on the volleyball court this season but the coaches had coordinated a "pink out" cancer benefit and it was also the Haymaker's parents night.

Although it was tight the whole way, the Swedes pushed ahead 24-21 in the first set before giving up five straight Haymaker points.
