

Mroczek signs to play football for UNK Lopers

Of course Tannor Mroczek has dreamed big on the football field.

With high school statistics that mark both the kickoff and punt return records as well as the top single season rushing average, who wouldn't.

But while it would be a dream come true to be recruited by big schools with nationally recognized programs, Mroczek just wants to play.

That's why Mroczek chose to sign his national letter of intent on Feb. 2 to play football for the University of Nebraska at Kearney.
