

## Boys finish fourth at state CC meet

KEARNEY—With average times better than previous performances at Kearney as well as a state medal and a fourth-place team finish, the Gothenburg boys cross country team has plenty of reason to be proud of the way it ended the 2009 season on Friday.

Swede senior Andrew Collins earned his third straight medal in 10th place at the state cross country meet as the boys finished fourth in the team standings behind champion Norfolk Catholic, Ogallala and Wayne.

“Class C was tremendously tough this year,” said Gothenburg coach Steve Reeves. “Even though the boys had an outstanding performance, I think they were a little disappointed.”

After such a solid season, Reeves said the Swedes had hoped to bring home a trophy.

“We did the best we could and had a little better times across the board,” he said. “That’s all we can ask.”

Norfolk Catholic won its fourth straight team title behind all-class gold medal winner Jarren Heng, a Knight senior.

Heng's time of 16:05.5 gave him his second Class C individual title and was the best of all runners in all classes.

Reeves said the Swedes defeated Class D state champion Hastings St. Cecilia earlier in the year and competed well against Class B champion Lexington all season.

"There was just an awful lot of talent in our class," Reeves said.

Collins becomes the first Gothenburg runner to earn three state medals, the coach said.

Collins qualified for the state meet all four years, finishing just outside a medal as a freshman.

"Obviously it's going to hurt losing Andrew next year," Reeves said, "and Eric Stevens too but we have a lot of kids coming back who will be successful again if they set their goals high and work hard in the off-season."

Sophomore Brett Dockweiler was just two spots from earning his first state medal, finishing in 17th place.

Fellow sophomores Bryce Eggleston and Joshua Clark came in 22nd and 33rd respectively, while junior Luke Rehmert and Stevens were 68th and 69th out of 91 runners.

"These kids have a lot of character and a great work ethic," Reeves said. "If a coach could have this kind of group every year, he'd coach forever."
