Stienike, O'Hare leave their mark

LEXINGTON—Two swimmers on the Gothenburg Swim Team earned high point medals during the 2009 Plains tSunami Swim League championships on July 18 at Lexington.

Gracie Stienike finished second in overall points earned in the 8 and under girls division. Ryan O'Hare took the top spot in the 30 and older men's group.

Individual points are earned by the swimmers based on race finishes, the same way team points are awarded.

Both swimmers finished the meet with new league records as well.

O'Hare set new championship meet records in all four events he was entered. He won the 100 long freestyle, 25 breaststroke, 25 short freestyle and the 100 individual medley.

Stienike won both the 50 freestyle and the 25 backstroke, setting a new record in the backstroke.

Lauren Johnson was a gold medal winner as well in the 8 and under girls 25 backstroke.

Medals were given to the top eight in the individual events and the top four in the relays.

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As a team, Gothenburg finished 10th of 20 competing in the league championships.

The Gothenburg Swim Team recognized most improved swimmers over the season.

Those participants and their total time improvements were: Kayla Anderson, 80.52 seconds; Wyatt Anderson, 51.93 seconds; Emma Jorgenson, 50.27 seconds; Madeline Jorgenson, 46.22 seconds; Roman Schmidt, 45.04 seconds; Megan Moore, 42.16 seconds; Gracie Stienike, 32.87 seconds; Tyler Brass, 26.41 seconds; and Brodie Stienike, 19.78 seconds.

The swim team is open to participants of all ages. Although the swim meet season has ended, members will continue to practice once a month during the winter.
