Senior Melon losing streak stretches to 10 games

It's been a rough ride and coaches have had to ward off total discouragement as the Senior Melons extended a losing streak, falling three more times on the road last week.

Ogallala defeated Gothenburg 16-0 after four innings and the Melons fell to Aurora twice in a double-header, 10-0 and 10-1.

That drops the Seniors' record to 2-17 as they head into the final stretch of the season.

Gothenburg finishes out the regular season at home hosting Overton on Friday followed by Lexington's Juniors on Saturday and Shelton-Gibbon on Sunday.

Seeding for the Senior Legion Area 6 tournament that begins July 24 at Minden will be completed by Monday.

Aurora double trouble
