The Melons trailed Cambridge after three innings, 3-2.

Two errors, a walk and a single contributed to two more runs for Cambridge in the top of the fourth.

Over the next three innings, the Melons only had one hit that was followed by a double-play and a pop-out.

A run-filled top of the fifth extended Cambridge's lead to 14-2. Six of eight Cambridge batters reached base, and put the game out of reach for the Melons.

Gothenburg's Kowalewski led off the seventh with a single to left field, but was forced out at second on a Braedan Brundage grounder.

Logan Carlson reached base on a walk moving Brundage to second. A grounder to the Cambridge first baseman advanced the runners to second and third.

Brundage stole home and on the play, a wild throw from the catcher allowed Carlson to cross the plate scoring the fourth run for the Melons.

Messersmith stole three bases and Dominic Long started the ball game on the mound and had six strikeouts in the loss.
