

Gothenburg earns 4th sportsmanship award

Gothenburg is one of three schools in the state to be honored for sportsmanship for the fourth consecutive year by the Nebraska School Activities Association.

That speaks highly of athletic director Seth Ryker, who puts the program together, as well as the rest of the staff and students, superintendent Mike Teahon said as he informed the board of education about the honor at the regular monthly meeting Monday.
