Regan Geiken, who etched her name in a number of the Gothenburg record books this season, and Emily Franzen were four-year varsity players.

Aryn Meisinger and Taylor Mroczek played varsity roles the last two years and Kyndal Holmes improved as this season progressed, the coach said.

“They were willing to buy into what I wanted to do,” Lecher said, “and they always worked hard.”

Next season MaKaela Franzen will return as a starter but the depth of the team is questionable.

“We have to do some summer (team camps) because we will be inexperienced,” Lecher said. “It’s not all about winning and losing in the summer. It’s a good time to improve and gain experience.”
