HYANNIS—It's been a long dry spell for the Brady football team.

After spotting Hyannis a pair of touchdowns and two point-after conversions in the first seven minutes of the game Friday night, Brady battled back with 22 unanswered points through the third quarter.

Sideline fans had high hopes of the Eagles ending a 19-game losing streak.

Then the tide turned. What went right for the Eagles in the first three periods of play didn't go so well in the fourth quarter.

Hyannis put 22 points on the board in the fourth to beat Brady 44-28.

"I think we may have had some first-game jitters early," said Brady coach Darren Tobey. "When we settled down, we did OK."

Actually, he said, they did better than just OK. They did just what they were supposed to do.

"We held Hyannis out from five minutes into the game until well into the third quarter," Tobey said.

"I don't know the last time we scored like that," Tobey said. "And I couldn't tell you the last time we went into halftime with a lead."

Up 22-16 at halftime, the Eagles held their own during the third quarter, giving up one scoring drive right before the final period.

Then Tobey said he believes fear crept in.

"It was almost like they looked at the scoreboard and said, 'Oh no. It's tied in the fourth quarter. Now I can't make a mistake,'" he said.
