

Mullen wins SHC championship.

If the Brady girls could have put together an average quarter for the final eight minutes of the Sandhills Conference championship Friday night at home, they may have knocked off state-ranked Mullen.

But Brady only mustered five points in the fourth period against the Broncos and had to settle for the second-place trophy.

"It was a rough game both ways," said Eagle coach Lance Arterburn. "I still feel like we are just as good a team as they are. We just haven't found a way to beat them yet."

Brady trailed the Broncos 17-15 after the first quarter and was down eight points 33-25 at halftime.


Then the Eagles turned things around in the third period.
