

After stomping Hyannis at home Friday night and a three-hour bus ride into the Sandhills Saturday afternoon, Brady basketball coach Rich Britten wasn't sure what to expect from his boys on the court at Cody-Kilgore.

The Cowboys handled the Eagles in Brady the previous week in the Sandhills Conference consolation game but Britten said he knew the Eagles were fired up and ready to avenge that loss.
