Boys finish regular season 15-7

DUNNING—Brady's boys could only squeeze two points out of the first quarter during Friday night's finish to the regular season.

That's a solid 10 points below their per-quarter average on the year.

The Knights held Brady well below their points-per-game average as well, pounding the Eagles 61-36.

"We had some momentum at that point and we were making a run," Jacobs said. "It was a questionable call that forced a big swing. Instead of cutting the lead to eight, all of a sudden we're looking at 12 or 13 points and it seems insurmountable again."

Senior Zach Mann finished with 12 points and nine rebounds to lead the Eagles.

Brady ended the regular season with a 15-7 record, now focusing on the post-season.
