### **After overtime loss at home, Brady falls to 1-5.**

Brady couldn't match Arnold's four players in double figures during the first round of the Maxwell Booster Tournament last week and then allowed Stapleton-McPherson County its first win of the season.

In the opening round Dec. 21, Arnold made 25 free throws compared with Brady's six shots from the line to win 53-41.

Coach Rich Britten said that's a real telling statistic for the boys.

"We're simply not getting to the free throw line enough," he said.

Arnold led 15-13 at the end of the first quarter and went up 33-24 with a Chase Schwarz buzzer-beater at halftime.

Both teams struggled to score in the third period and Arnold outlasted a Brady run in the fourth.

Christian Arterburn led the Eagles with 15 points. Nathan Montoya and Devan Polt pulled down eight rebounds each.

In the final nine seconds before halftime, Kyle Pohlman hit a layup and a three-pointer to pull Brady within five, 27-22.

“We knew we were going to have to come out strong in the third quarter and that just didn't happen,” Britten said.

SMC outscored Brady 18-4 from the free throw line.

Pohlman led the Eagles in scoring with 13 points and Tyler Egenberger chipped in eight. Brad Ward had seven rebounds.

“We scored more in field goals than both Arnold and SMC but we just didn't get to the line enough,” Britten said.

Despite losing 69-58 in overtime to Paxton in the first round of the Brady Holiday Tournament, Britten is encouraged by a marked improvement in play.

Down 49-46 with just a handful of ticks left on the clock, Brady senior Corbin Blede hit a huge three-pointer to tie.

Two seconds remained in regulation when an unplanned Brady foul sent Paxton's Cooper Bollman to the line.

The Tiger senior missed both free throws to send the game into overtime.

"We just got a little too excited during the overtime, including me," Britten said, "and it got away from us."

Arterburn, Blede and Pohlman scored 10 points each for the Eagles.

"We just played so much better as a team," Britten said. "I think there are good things to come."

Brady faced Wauneta-Palisade in the consolation game on Tuesday.
