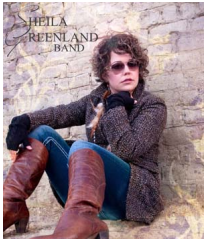


## Brady Days celebrates 125th anniversary of village founding

There's much to celebrate during Brady Days 2014.

The annual festival, which is Aug. 1-3, will commemorate the 125th anniversary of the founding of Brady Island.

Organized in 1889, Brady Island was named by explorer John Fremont after Brady Meeks, the leader of a group of trappers Fremont found on a Platte River island about 20 miles east of where the North and South Platte rivers converge.

It's been said that Brady Island had the only saloon between Grand Island and Cheyenne and that thousands of cattle traded hands through a stockyard here.

A few other significant things happened in the world in 1889—North Dakota, South Dakota, Montana and Washington became states; Benjamin Harrison succeeded Grover Cleveland as president of the United States; the Eiffel Tower was inaugurated in Paris; Adolph Hitler was born; and the Coca-Cola company originally incorporated as the Pemberton Medicine Company.

Back to present day, there are plenty of new and old activities for the entire family planned for the anniversary celebration.

New among Friday's events are kids games downtown, a beard-growing contest and a "Brady's Got Talent" talent show.
