Four Brady High School students have qualified to compete in the state Family Career and Community Leaders of America STAR contest in April.

STAR is Students Taking Action with Recognition and involves competitive events in which members are recognized for proficiency and achievement in chapter and individual projects, leadership skills and career preparation.
