Gothenburg's wrestling team and staff were excited to start the second half of the season in Ogallala Saturday.

The Swedes used that enthusiasm to earn third place in the Ogallala Invite posting a 3-2 record in the duals tournament.

Gothenburg managed to beat Chase County, Hershey and Sidney while falling to eventual champion Gordon-Rushville and Ogallala.

"We wrestled well as a team and did some good things," head coach Tom Scott said. "I was pleased with our preparation and we won a majority of our matches due to our conditioning."

That conditioning proved important with two guys unable to compete due to sickness the day of the invite.

"We had to overcome that adversity," Scott said.

When those guys went down the team stepped up and continued to wrestle hard.

In round one Gothenburg defeated Chase County 46-24.

That dual was followed by a 51-30 loss to Gordon-Rushville and the Swedes were defeated 48-30 by Ogallala before pool matches began.



Once in pool rounds, Gothenburg beat Sidney 42-36 and Hershey 48-32 to earn a spot on the podium.

"The most important thing is we won more close matches than we lost," Scott said. "But we still have room for improvement."

Gothenburg's best record belonged to sophomore Jayden Miller who went 5-0 at 152 pounds.

"We've been expecting good things from him since November," Scott said. "This weekend he wrestled well and was where we want him to be."

The Swedes look to continue wrestling well in the Lexington Duals on Friday starting at 1:30 p.m. and against Cozad at home Tuesday.

At Lex, Gothenburg faces three district opponents in its first three matches. Those are must-win matchups, Scott said.
